VENTILATION

OBJECTIVE SIGNS OF IMPAIRED VENTILATION:

- Asymmetrical chest wall excursion
- Decreased or absent air entry
- Tachypnea
- Pulse oximetry

So, say the patient is intubated already:

IS THE OXYGENATION ADEQUATE?

- Pulse oximetry will tell you the SaO2 but not the PaO2
 - o It is unreliable in
 - poor perfusion
 - anaemia
 - hypothermia
 - blood pressure cuff is above the sensor
 - the sensor is on an injured extremity
 - carboxyhemoglobin or methemoglobin

IS THE VENTILATION ADEQUATE?

- Bagging and masking should be performed by 2 people where possible

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
